All vegetables must be grown, selected, and arranged by the exhibitor.

Entries are to be dropped off on Wednesday night along with a 3x5 card stating exhibitor's name.

Score card: Quality 60%
 General Effect 20%

I. Exhibits:

1. Display of at least 5 kinds of vegetables in an appropriate container such as a chopping bowl, basket, tray, or wheelbarrow.
2. Salad Bowl Class-Lettuce, endive, chicory, escarole, etc.
3. Mixed Bowl Class- Vegetables, fruit, and gourds.

II. Standard Market Package Class:

1. Collection of vegetables packed as for market
2. Best Market Package
 - a. Standard box or 12 qt. Basket- beans, beets, carrots, celery, potatoes, onion, etc.
 - b. 12 qt. Basket of red tomatoes
 - c. 12 qt. Basket of green tomatoes
 - d. Bags of Potatoes-5lb., 10lb., 20lb., 50lb.
 - e. Bags of Onions- 5lb., 10 lb., 20lb., 50lb.
